



## Pupil Premium Report 2014-2015

### What is Pupil Premium?

Pupil Premium is funding provided to school funding. It is allocated according to the number of pupils on roll (Year R to Year 11) who are:

- eligible for free school meals and/or
- pupils who have been looked after, in care (CLA) for 6 months or more

The Pupil Premium is additional funding given to schools by the Government so that schools can support particular groups who could be at risk of underachieving and work to ensure that the progress of these pupils is close to or matches that of their peers.

It is for the school to decide how the Pupil Premium funding is spent, since they are best placed to assess what provision should be made for the individual pupils within their responsibility.

Free School Meal eligibility:

2014/2015 Pupil premium per pupil = £900

Children that are looked after eligibility:

2014/2015 Pupil Premium per pupil = £1500




## Pupil Premium Expenditure 2014-2015

Following the success of the Sensory Playground in the Secondary Playground and with the increase in pupils in Early Years, it was felt essential that the Early Years and Lower Playground was developed to ensure all pupils have access to an excellent outside learning environment and a large proportion of the Pupil Premium was invested in this outdoors area.



We recognised the need this year, to upgrade the Interactive Screens used in classrooms to a product that better suited the pupil's needs. The new screens do not use a projector and can therefore be mounted lower on the wall, at the pupil's height and do not have shadows on the screen. These screens have proved very beneficial in all classes.



### Outcomes

Historically there has not been a significant gap in achievement for pupils on FSM or CLA at St John's.

### Pupils eligible for FSM -

Of 45 pupils assessed 40 exceeded expectations in one or more subject areas.

### CLA pupils -

Of 5 pupils assessed, all 5 exceeded expectations in 4 or more of subject areas.
